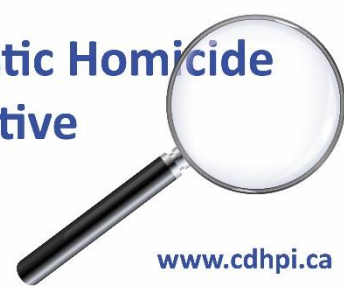


Project activities

 - Interviews with survivors of high-risk domestic violence or loved ones of domestic homicide victims

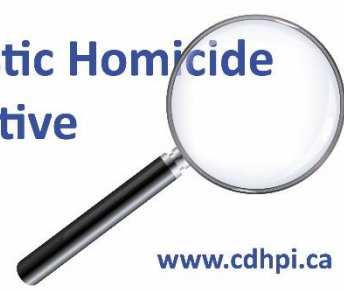
- The data collected was used in more than 10 theses and dissertations.
